Brother Dean Platt - #321 Helps to Beautify the Property of the Iowa State Chapter

As many of you know, the Board had a storage shed constructed to hold many of the items used to maintain the property such as our lawn mower, rakes, shovels and so on. Once we had the storage shed built, the City of Ames Building Code required that we place a fence in front of the shed (to hide it from view from the street), and then place shrubbery in front of the fence, to hide the view of the fence from the street!

Responding to our request for help with determining the correct type of plants to use for this project, Brother Dean Platt stepped forward and donated a considerable number of bushes and hosta plants to the active chapter to be used for this project. Over two consecutive weekends in October (the 13th and the 20th), Brother Platt and his wife took time out of their busy schedule to deliver plants that he donated from his nursery business in Waterloo for planting around the chapter house.

The first weekend, Brother Platt delivered a number of bushes for planting in front of the fence around the storage shed, and he also provided us with thirty hosta plants for use near the northeast corner of the chapter house. Brother Platt also provided us with all of the information that we would need to correctly place and plant the items. While he was there on October 13th, he volunteered to go ahead and measure the front of the house, take sketches of the property, and then prepare a new planting layout for us to use. The following weekend, October 20th, he came back and delivered another set of plants to be used in the front of the house.

Alumni Respond with Generous Support for Capital Improvement and Scholarship Programs

Both the **capital improvement** and **scholarship funds** have received generous support from our alumni this year! Enclosed with this newsletter you will find the summary sheets identifying all of our alumni who have contributed to both of these campaigns. To date, we have received **\$11,930** in donations for capital improvements fund and **\$5,201** in donations for the scholarship fund. Our thanks go out to all of the alumni who have so generously contributed to these funds this year, and we hope that as you take a look at your financial situation for the 2006 calendar year, you will consider supporting either one or both of these funds this year.

Our initial goal for the capital improvements fund is to replace the remaining windows in the chapter house with new, energy efficient windows just like the ones we installed a couple of years ago. The chapter members have been very energy conscious, but we need to help them as much as we can by finishing the installation of new windows in the chapter house. We estimate that this project will cost approximately \$20,000. At this point we are right at 60% of that goal with the funds that we have raised so far. If we can raise the remaining \$8,000 we need for this project by the end of the year, we should be able to get the windows replaced in January and see some energy savings for heating the chapter house yet this year.

Our second objective is to “gut” the rooms on the third floor and completely re-wire and insulate them. You may recall that we have already replaced the windows on the third floor. We have since discovered that the exterior walls and ceilings

are not insulated. Also, the wiring on this floor is quite old, and really needs to be replaced. We estimate that the cost to renovate the third floor will also cost us about \$20,000. However, we are “selling” the naming rights to the three rooms on the third floor to any alumnus of the chapter who like to have a room named after them for a donation to this part of the renovation project for \$5,000 per room. Any alumnus (or group of alumni) who would like to contribute to this project can designate a room to be named in their honor in exchange for their contribution.

The third phase of the project is not very glamorous, but it is of vital importance to the long-term structural integrity of the chapter house. We need to tuck point the most of the building, as after all these years, much of the mortar in many places has been worn down to next to nothing. The Board had some of the work done last year on the south side of the house, but we need to complete a lot of the work on the west and specially north sides of the chapter house.

Our final objective in the capital improvements campaign is to completely renovate the basement area of the chapter house. The goal is to provide an all purpose recreation / chapter meeting room area for the men in the chapter house. To accomplish this, we plan to tear out the bar area and push back the walls to open up more space in the area as a whole. This would allow for more seating and turn the room into a multi-purpose chapter meeting and recreation room.

This part of the project is the most ambitious, and the most costly. Given all of the structural work that will have to be

done in the ceiling and walls, we estimate that this phase of the project will cost us approximately \$80,000.

I want to emphasize that all of these projects are really needed in order for us to maintain the type of property that we feel is necessary to attract and support the type of men that we have recruited as members of our chapter. I also need to point out that contributions to this fund are **not tax-deductible**. Although that there have been efforts made in Congress to make donations for projects such as these tax-deductible, it does not appear likely that action on this legislation will take place anytime in the near future.

Any amount that you could contribute to this fund would be greatly appreciated!

We also want to thank all of our alumni who have contributed generously to our **scholarship fund** this year as well. The funds that you contribute to this fund **are tax-deductible** and are used to support the scholarship programs that have discussed at length in the newsletter.

These funds have proved to be a significant factor in our recruitment efforts for new members, as they are a tangible signal that we as a Fraternity value academic performance and are willing to support the members of the chapter in achieving their academic goals. I know that based on discussions that I have had with the parents of our members, that they really appreciate the fact that we consider it important to help support their sons in covering the cost of their college education. But we could not do this without the support of our alumni who make this happen.

I know that at this time of the year, you are receiving requests for contributions from many worthwhile organizations. I hope that you will think of your chapter as being worthy of your financial support this holiday season. And as always, we remain grateful for all of the support that we have received in the past. Your support has really made a difference in the success that has occurred, and we thank you for your generosity!

Alumni and family members attend Scholarship Awards Banquet on October 13th

Nearly sixty alumni, family and chapter members turned out for an evening banquet in the Memorial Union to recognize and celebrate the academic success of the members of the active chapter. The **Award for Outstanding Service** is an award given to the undergraduate brother who has worked diligently to improve Acacia. This year's recipient was **Nicholas Seibold**. As the Senior Steward for the chapter, Nicholas has invested numerous hours to help improve the physical property.

The **Award for Good of the Fraternity** is an award given to the undergraduate brother who has worked to improve the public image of the chapter within the Greek and campus communities. This year's recipient was **Trevor Owens**. During the past year, Trevor redesigned the chapter's website and has also helped to coordinate a number of social functions with a number of sorority chapters at Iowa State.

This year's recipient was **Clark Richardson**. During the past year, Clark has assumed a number of high-profile leadership positions within the university community and that has brought a tremendous amount of positive visibility to the chapter.

The **Award for Commitment to Acacia** is an award given to the undergraduate brother who has invested a vast amount of time and energy to help the chapter succeed. This year's recipient was **Michael Weber**. During the past year, Michael has shown a tremendous commitment to the chapter and is the brother who is not afraid to work hard behind the scene to ensure activities and events are successful for the chapter.

The **Acacian of the Year** award is an award given to the undergraduate brother who best exemplifies the ideals of Acacia. This year's recipient was **Dan Congreve**. During the past year, Dan has not only been instrumental in helping to create an academic success plan for the chapter, but also embodies academic success himself. Additionally, Dan also coordinated the chapter's waterball tournament philanthropy project and through his leadership, the philanthropy project was a success. As the recipient of the Acacian of the Year award, Dan will also receive a \$250 scholarship for the spring 2007 semester.
